In and About in Marlow:
Situating on the River Thames just 30 miles from London, Marlow is surrounded by the Chilterns Hills Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty.

The town is famous for its 19th century suspension bridge built in 1832. It also boasts an eclectic range of pubs and restaurants and the renowned Compleat Angler Hotel.

Marlow also has a rich literary history; it has been home to TS Elliott, Jerome K. Jerome and Mary Shelley.

By Car:

From the M4, and the A404; at the first major roundabout take the first left into Marlow. Follow the road over the bridge over the Thames. Go straight ahead at the double mini roundabout into the High Street.

From the M40, and the A404; take the first major left on the A4155, and follow the road to the right over the motorway. Go straight ahead over three mini roundabouts into Marlow town centre. At the fourth mini roundabout (with Boots on your right) turn left into the High Street.

The Brewery Courtyard can be found half way up the High Street. We're directly across the road from Institute Road. As you walk into the Brewery Courtyard, under the arch, The Old Barrel Store is straight ahead.

Car Parking:

The closest place to park is along Institute Road, c. 300m, on the right. It is a pay and display public car park.

By Train and Taxi:

Trains from London Marylebone and Birmingham go to High Wycombe. A taxi from High Wycombe to Marlow takes around 10 minutes.

Trains from Paddington and Reading go to Maidenhead; a branch line travels onwards to Marlow. We're 5 minutes walk from Marlow station.
